


Workshop- Guild member, Kennette Bledsoe will lead us through the steps to create our personalized and embellished project bag on mesh canvas.



January 19 Little Gem needle felting and bead embroidery 2.5" round pin	Kit includes- Beadsmith Bead Foundation, felting needles and foam felting base, merino wool and wool-silk blends, E6000 glue, hand-crafted Czech glass button, size 11 and 5 seed beads, Fireline and One-G beading threads, beading needles. Finishing materials including the option of a pin or bracelet blank Bring basic stitching supplies including scissors, metal silverware spoon, bead mat, Copic or other alcohol ink brand marker in dark purple (purchased at Dick Blick or office supply store), light and magnification if needed.
February 16 mixed media painted fabric	Kit includes- ModPodge, Gessoboard supports: 8 x 10", paint brushes, water cups, chopsticks, paint tray, non-latex protective gloves, shared tubes of acrylic paints, colored papers, and fabric. Bring scissors (small size for fussy cutting) and tweezers (which will get gluey). Participants are encouraged to bring fabric of their own; scraps, or a piece with which to cover the entire support and wrap the edges.
March 16 rug hooking 8" X 8"	Kit includes- one 5 inch by 7 inch nature scene drawn on linen, one hook and enough wool and yarn to hook the entire piece.
April 20 personalized 'Sew Emma' project bag	No Kit - Purchase your bag at https://www.itssewemma.com/peony-mad-for-plaid-project-bag Bring the Sew Emma bag you purchased, needles, threads embellishments, lighting and magnification, if needed.
May 18 embroidered card making	Kit includes- notecards. Bring your own needle, threads and embellishments.


